
The Carbon Offset Universe




B.C. Offset Program Overview




BC's Carbon Offset Program supports:

- Additional GHG emission reductions and removals; and
- 2) Transition to a resilient, innovative, low-carbon economy that works for everyone.

Process for registering projects and receiving credits



B.C.'s Forest Carbon Offset Protocol

Activities enabled:

- Afforestation / reforestation (tree planting)
- Conservation / improved forest management (reduced harvest)
- Avoided conversion (from forest land to non-forest land)
- Assesses four key safeguards for carbon offset projects:
 - Real and conservative: An emissions reductions must be measurable and conservatively estimated.
 - Additional: Justification of baseline and project scenarios.
 - Permanent: Account to manage for forest fires, pest, disease, etc.
 - Verifiable: Proponents must include evidence of emissions reductions which is reviewed by a third-party verification and validation body.

Preliminary considerations for forest carbon offset projects

- **Scale:** Is the project large enough to overcome monitoring, reporting, and verification costs?
- Additionality: Is it a new management practice or an intervention in historic activities?
- Activity: Is the activity eligible under the protocol?
- Property rights: Do you have the property rights for the credits, or is work underway to get those property rights?

Current status and next steps

FCOP:

- Legal review underway.
- Release is imminent.
- Guidance and requirements for existing projects grandparented under the *Greenhouse Gas Industrial* Reporting and Control Act currently under development. For release alongside the protocol.
- Guidance and requirements for developing projects on Crown land is currently under development. Release will be later in 2022.
