My job duties were not limited to, but included: Lands Registry, housing, events coordinator, and administrative support. I have also worked as the Community Comprehensive Planner for Aitchelitz and the Housing Maintenance Coordinator for Skowkale. I sit on multiple committees for the Stó:lō Xwexwilmexw Treaty. I have volunteered a lot of time helping my community for community engagements and deliver supplies to members during this pandemic. I'm currently getting mentored for future political involvement.
