# **State of Emergency extended to December 14, 2021**

# DATE: December 10, 2021

**NEW INFORMATION IN BLUE** 

HAZARDS: FLOODING (Atmospheric River Event Nov 13-15 and Nov 27-30)

- EMBC Regional Offices: 3 PREOCs Activated: Vancouver Island and Coastal Region; Southwest; and Central operating in response to impacted Indigenous communities and local authorities. EMBC Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre is also activated to support the Regional Offices.
- First Nation Agency Representatives (including ISC, FNESS, FNHA, and MIRR Strategic Liaison, Safety and Consultation Branch) participating in multiple operational coordination calls daily and supporting communities as needed.

### **PROVINCIAL OVERVIEW:**

*Weather*: A strong winter storm is forecast to affect many parts of B.C. from Friday to Sunday. Heavy rain on the Coast, snow in parts of the Interior and mountain passes and high winds across much of the province may make for a challenging weekend in areas recovering from November's weather impacts and for the transportation sector. Environment and Climate Change Canada has issued multiple Rainfall, Snowfall, Wind and Winter Storm warnings. <u>https://weather.gc.ca/warnings/index\_e.html?prov=bc</u> The River Forecast Centre has issued High Streamflow Advisories for Vancouver Island, the South Coast and the Tulameen River. <u>Flood Warnings and Advisories - River Forecast Centre - Province of British Columbia (gov.bc.ca)</u>

**Overview**: With the significantly improved situation, the focus is largely on recovery and managing outstanding risks including river debris and logjams. The province continues to respond to catastrophic damage to major routes between the Lower Mainland through to Hope and the remainder of the province. Fuel and travel restrictions remain in place under the *Emergency Program Act* (EPA). Ministry of Transportation (MOTI) advises the Coquihalla and the Nicola Highway (8) will take months to repair.

### **Recovery Supports:**

- Indigenous communities that have infrastructure damage because of the recent flooding should submit a local government DFA application as soon as possible and no later than March 3, 2022. Local government application forms and additional information are available on the EMBC website: <u>https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/safety/emergency-management/local-emergency-programs/financial/communities-dfa</u>.
- Canadian Red Cross (CRC) has an Indigenous Peoples Responders in place for registration teams. People who remain evacuated are must register with CRC online at <a href="http://www.redcross.ca/2021bcfloods">http://www.redcross.ca/2021bcfloods</a> or by calling 1-800-585-9559. The CRC website lists locations where people can receive in-person supports. The CRC provided a flyer for distribution on Dec 10.
- Drywall Disposal Guidance has been shared with all Emergency Programs Coordinators: <u>drywall disposal policy guidance for flood.pdf</u> (gov.bc.ca) as well as Debris Management <u>Debris Management Guidelines (gov.bc.ca)</u>
- Indigenous Services Canada is also working directly with communities to proactively ensure that funding sources are in place to ensure that there is no gap in service with the December 15<sup>th</sup> transition.

### Items of Common Interest:

Concerns that have been removed to manage length of this list continue to be tracked by EMBC and followed up on as appropriate.

- EMBC has begun the transition to recovery, and calls are shifting to mainly agency updates to share information with regard to reimbursements, Disaster Financial Assistance, and transitioning those still evacuated to long-term services covered by Canadian Red Cross.
- EMBC Southwest's Indigenous Operational Area Coordinators have been doing community reach out calls regarding recovery needs.
- EMBC, FNHA and FNESS have been conducting site visits to affected communities including Coldwater, and Shackan, Halalt and Penalukut. An expanded version of this Multi-Agency Support Team met with Cowichan Tribes today. Minister Murray Rankin met with Chiefs and delegates from the Merritt and Highway 8 area on Dec 7, this occurred virtually as planned flights were impacted by weather.

# FIRST NATION RECEPTION CENTRE UPDATES:

There are likely more reception centres and/or Indigenous support networks that what is provided here, as well as many informal arrangements that aren't yet known.

- **Cowichan Tribes:** Community centre and gym have transitioned from reception centres to resiliency centres.
- Lytton First Nation is managing the reception centre (and their EOC) at Camp Hope.
- Seabird Island Band: Gym and band office open as warming centres.

# **AGENCY UPDATES:**

- FNESS is transitioning from response to recovery. A recovery position has been established and other management positions have shifted from a response to a recovery focus. Staff from Alberta and the Yukon are being sent home and as of end of day Dec 10 the EOC will be shutting down.
- FNESS flood tools on the EOC support website and resources available to impacted communities: <u>First Nations Emergency Services Society of BC</u> <u>Lightship Maps</u>.
- FNESS collaborated with GEOBC to ensure resources are leveraged to capture and analyze data to mitigate risk and support to First Nations and other communities impacted by flooding and wildfire in British Columbia.
- FNESS worked with Central PREOC to access professional services such as Geomorphologists to perform more in-depth analysis of the data to identify strategies and actions to protect human life, property and support in recovery planning.
- First Nation Health Authority (FNHA) is transitioning into recovery and continue to support traditional health and wellness needs. Traditional and Cultural wellness supports are in all ESS centres that are still open, including Merritt.
- Transport Canada announced up to \$300K in new funding to support local and Indigenous community-based rail safety engagement. The Community Participation Funding Program-Rail Safety Component aims to provide short-term grants with the goal of supporting the participation of eligible communities and organizations in the development and improvement of Canada's rail safety transportation system. Recipients will be encouraged to share their knowledge and expertise of local environments to help inform rail safety initiatives and future programming.
- All <u>road closures</u> can be found at DriveBC.
- ISC is transitioning into recovery holding 1:1 calls with Nations to determine their specific recovery needs.
- MIRR has released a new consultation bulletin regarding <u>Consulting First Nations During Emergency or Critical Circumstances</u> following the recent extreme weather events.
- MIRR is staffing the PECC in-person as an Agency Representative, and the SWE PREOC in functional roles. This team is actively supporting EMBC in the response effort and is available to provide strategic advice, guidance and participate in other response related needs as required. The Profiles of Indigenous Peoples tool is continually being updated to ensure that staff working with Indigenous communities are aware of impacts.
