Key Findings



Awareness of Indigenous Issues More than half of Canadians (53%) report a high awareness (score of 7-10 out of 10) of the issues affecting First Nations and Canadians aged 55 plus are more likely to be aware (mean of 6.5) compared to Canadians aged 18 to 34 years old (mean of 5.8). Relationship between First Nations and the Government of Canada When asked what comes to mind when thinking of the relationship between First Nations and the Government of Canada, Canadians most often say a lack of trust and broken promises (11%), followed by a lack of actions from the government (10%) and poor, fractured and broken (9%). Canada's Job Reducing Poverty Canadians are four times more likely to say that Canada is doing a poor job (32%) than a good job (8%) at reducing poverty for First Nations. Residents of BC (41%) are more likely to think Canada is doing a poor job than Quebecers (27%).



Reducing uncertainty of Resource Development Decisions Over four in ten Canadians (41%) believe that including First Nations as partners in resource development projects decreases the uncertainty of development decisions, while less than two in ten believe it increases uncertainty (17%). Just over one in five (21%) say it has no impact on uncertainty.







Impact on Speed of Economic Recovery

Just over one in two Canadians (52%) believe that addressing economic inequalities between First Nations and Canada has no impact on the speed of Canada's economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. Canadians are three times more likely to say this increases the speed (28%) than decreases the speed (8%).

Role of First Nations in Government response to Climate Change A strong majority of Canadians say First Nations should play a major role (43%) or minor role (38%) in the government's response to climate change, while just one in ten say they should play no role.





Support for Ensuring Equal Level of Services Almost nine in ten Canadians support (67%) or somewhat support (21%) having the Government of Canada ensure that First Nations have services matching the level of services provided to other Canadians.






Awareness of issues affecting First Nations








Canada reducing poverty for First Nations




Do you believe that Canada does a very good, good, average, poor or very poor job at reducing poverty for First Nations?








Role of First Nations in the government's response to climate change




Should First Nations play a major, minor or no role in the government's response to climate change?






Support for a national infrastructure strategy for First Nations reserves

Support for First Nations governments running First Nations child and family services on reserves








Support for having universal child-care for First Nations on reserves




Support for First Nations having access to early childhood education





Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and celllines) random telephone survey of 1,028 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between April 1st and 3rd, 2021 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey. The sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,028 Canadians is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was commissioned by the Assembly of First Nations and was conducted by Nanos Research.
