BCAFN Statement Regarding Grand Chief Edward John Arrest

(Lheidli T'enneh Territory, Prince George, BC – November 15, 2019) – The BC Assembly of First Nations (BCAFN) is aware that Grand Chief Ed John has been arrested related to sexual offenses to have occurred in 1974. The accusation is a grave matter that must be taken very seriously, and which is now in the justice system.

BCAFN will not make further comments until this case has been concluded.
